



The Pyrenees National Park (approximately 15,000 hectares), west of Avoca, will comprise the existing Landsborough and Landsborough Hill nature conservation reserves (approximately 4,400 ha) and 10,600 hectares of the existing Pyrenees State Forest. Part of the park is situated in the Country of the Dja Dja Wurrung People.

The park will protect relatively undisturbed mixed species forests with extensive patches of mature eucalypts. It will also protect the highly restricted Pyrenees gum among many other threatened species.

Most current recreational activities can continue in the new national park. While most forms of recreational hunting and prospecting will not be permitted, seasonal recreational deer hunting (by stalking) will be permitted in the areas of the park that are currently State forest. Recreational prospecting will be permitted in the most prospective parts of the Pyrenees Range in the adjoining state forest, historical reserve and proposed regional park.
