

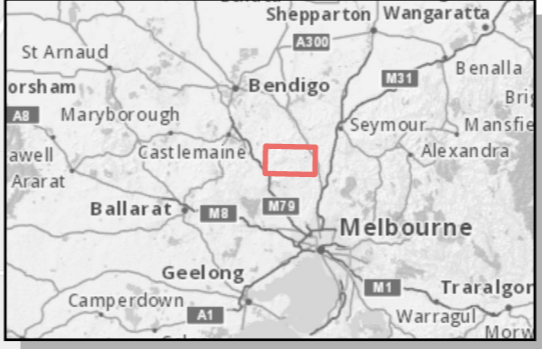
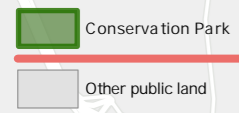
Key Features

Cobaw Conservation Park (approximately 2500 hectares), north-west of Lancefield, will comprise the existing Cobaw State Forest, which is located in a largely cleared landscape. The park is situated within the Countries of the Taungurung and Wurundjeri Woi Wurrung peoples.

The forest is an important ecological link between central west Victoria and the eastern highlands. The park will protect the habitat of many woodland birds and threatened species. The agile antechinus, brush-tailed phascogale, mountain brush-tailed possum and feathertail glider have all been recorded here.

Most current recreational activities can continue in the new park other than recreational hunting and prospecting. Horse riding and dog walking will be permitted in designated areas
